### Gallery Performances & Demonstrations

showcase a selection of intimate performative works.

### Bring Your Own Art → Open Stage

A space for artists, students and researchers, who want to present their current works in 5–10 min, following the 'first come, first present' principle.

### The Post-Pandemic City: a Provisional Profile → Panel Discussion

In this panel, specialists from different design and architecture faculties, such as the Politecnico di Milano and the University of Art and Design Linz, will give a short presentation of their recent researches while reflecting on interventions and strategies for urban spaces in times of a pandemic, followed by a discussion about provisional profiles for post-pandemic cities. Moderated by Anne Nigten.

## Leonardo Publishing & Mentoring Workshop

In this workshop, students will learn how to prototype their future in arts research and publication through mentorship. Included is an introduction of the Leonardo Abstract Services (LABS) and pro tips on preparing a (first) submission into LABS and Leonardo journal. ## 8 Unheimliche Freunde

Symposium in German

Around 1978, a metaphor found its way into English android research that the roboticist Masahiro Mori defined in 1970: the "uncanny valley". Robots that resemble humans too much spread fear and terror. Like us, but never familiar, they inhabit the "uncanny valley" according to Mori. 50 years after Mori, the symposium invites us to walk through the "uncanny valley" again. The focus is less on a human or machine resemblance, but rather on the doublings and repetitions: the uncanny friends. It is not the androids that seem uncanny, but the always-on interfaces, the Siris and Alexas, the Deep Fakes, and body sensors and surveillance systems that treat us like sleepers and future terrorists.

The conference of the Department of Media Theories (University of Art Linz, Gloria Meynen) will take place in cooperation with the International Research Centre for Cultural Studies (Internationales Forschungszentrum Kulturwissenschaften) and the Working Group Data and Networks of the Society for Media Studies (Gesellschaft für Medienwissenschaft).

## 9 Evening Lectures

Keynotes

### Thomas Macho

Thomas Macho (\*1952) served from 1993 to 2016 as Full Professor of Cultural History at the Department of Cultural History and Theory, Humboldt University of Berlin. In 1976 he received his doctorate at the University of Vienna with a dissertation on the philosophy of music; in 1984 he habilitated in philosophy at the University of Klagenfurt with a habilitation thesis on death metaphors. Since 2016 he has been director of the International Research Centre for Cultural Studies (IFK) at the University of Art and Design Linz in Vienna. In 2019 he was awarded the Sigmund Freud Prize for scholarly prose by the German Academy for Language and Poetry, and in 2020 the Austrian State Prize for Cultural Journalism.

### Janina Loh

Janina Loh (née Sombetzki) is a university assistant (post-doc) in the field of philosophy of technology and media at the University of Vienna. Janina Loh completed her doctorate at the Humboldt University Berlin about on the issue of responsibility (published in Springer 2014) and worked as a post-doctoral researcher at the Christian-Albrechts-University in Kiel. Loh's research interests lie in the field of trans- and posthumanism (especially critical posthumanism), robot ethics, feminist philosophy of technology, responsibility research, Hannah Arendt, theories of judgement, and ethics in the sciences.

### Lynn Hershman Leeson

For over fifty years, Hershman Leeson's practice mines the intersections of technology and the self. She is known for her groundbreaking contributions to media art from Artificial Intelligence to DNA programming, often anticipating the impact of technological developments on society.

In this lecture, she will give an overview of her work, particularly related to Cyborgs, from 1966 Breathing Machines, to 2018 Antibody and 2020 Gravity's End. The talk will bring together a selection of Hershman Leeson's

work in drawing, sculpture, video, and photography, along with interactive and net-based works, focusing on themes of transmutation, identity construction, and the evolution of the cyborg.

## 10 Interfacing Hauptplatz

AV- and interactive installation

Acting as the architectural interface between the main square and the ever-passing Danube, the facade of Hauptplatz 8 turns into a virtual window that opens to show the world beyond the local square. On several evenings during the Ars Electronica Festival, after the sun has set, different audiovisual projects are projected onto the media facade, inviting festival visitors and passers-by to enjoy and interact with them from near and far. Sound Campus is a new program especially oriented towards examining the state of experimental sound practices at universities and research centers. It opens a possibility for students and researchers to present new forms of understanding sonic art to the big audience of Ars Electronica Festival. This year's program, curated by Enrique Tomás, presents uneasy sound performances resonating in the face of a critical present. Intrusive music touching us despite lockdowns.

Next to local live performances in Linz, Sound Campus has firmly decided to connect with distant audiences by extending its resonant program towards the Internet. Sound artist Daniel Romero (aka "tape.") was invited to create a social and public virtual environment for sound art exhibition -the metaverse-.

## 12 Meter machen

Intervention

What do a cow, four dancing penguins, the rock musician Bruce Springsteen and a baby elephant have in common? – They are all supposed to help us keep our distance from each other. In some countries we speak of social distancing here. This actually means that we should have no contact at all. So we should not talk to each other or be friends. The Australians\* use a more correct term here: physical distancing. That means to keep only physical or spatial distance. But this distance is not the same everywhere. In Austria it is 1 meter long, in America 6 feet (approx. 1.8 meters) and in Latvia even 2 meters. Keeping a distance is a very important rule. But as we humans are, situations arise that are hilarious, super funny or totally confusing.
